**Theme: Garden Herbs**

Dill, oregano, fennel, thyme, parsley, mint, sage

**Theme: Companion planting**

Nasturtiums	Most aphids are attracted to it
Marigolds	Smell repels pests
Cucumbers with pot marigolds and nasturtiums	Repels aphids and beetles
Garlic with roses	Confuses and repels aphids
Onions with carrots	Confuses and repels carrot fly and onion fly
Peas with cabbages	Cabbages benefit from nitrogen fixing peas

Parsley with tomatoes	Smell repels pests
Potatoes with horseradish	Smell of horseradish repels Colorado beetle and helps with potato disease resistance
Chives and garlic with lettuce	Repels slugs and snails
Sweet peas	Attracts pollinators for beans (runners especially)
Tagetes sinuata	Decoy for eelworm when growing spuds
Peppers with basil	Smell repels pests
Parsley or wormwood with carrots	Repels carrot fly
Brassicas with pot marigold	Interplant to confuse cabbage fly
Tomatoes with basil	Repels aphids and spider mites
Tomatoes and carrots in a bed	Tomatoes repel carrot fly and provide shade
